
VetCEE Stakeholder questionnaire

General results

226¹ responses were received, mostly from Western European countries/respondents. 172 respondents filled out the questionnaire as an individual respondent, 54 respondents answered on behalf of their organization or company.




Of the population that answered on behalf of their organization or company, 7 respondents clearly indicated that they are not currently offering CPD, 4 of these respondents were veterinary general practitioners.

46 respondents currently organize CPD, mostly short courses/seminars/workshops, conferences and discipline specific modular programmes (see map below). 41% of these respondents provide non-accredited CPD, 59% provide CPD that is accredited.

In the following chapters we will analyze the responses in greater detail.



Respondents

Nearly 83% of the respondents were either veterinary general practitioners, veterinary academics/researchers or veterinary specialists.


4. Are you responding as an individual or on behalf of your organisation?



Also 10 representatives of Statutory Bodies participated in the questionnaire (Statutory Body of the following countries: Italy, Romania, Luxembourg, Switzerland, Denmark, Slovakia, UK, France and The Netherlands).

Respondents from a balanced mixture of organizations, institutions and statutory bodies replied.

87% of respondents that answered on behalf of their organization stated that their organization currently provides CPD to veterinarians. 13% do not offer CPD.

6. Is your organisation currently providing continuous professional development (CPD) options to veterinarians?




If we look into the kind of CPD that correspondents indicate to be providing, we can see that about 36% are short term courses or modules, 34% are conferences and modular programmes and 25% concerns a digital CPD offer e.g. online learning or an e-library.

41% of these respondents provide non-accredited CPD, 59% provide CPD that is accredited. Correspondents that indicated that the CPD provided was non-accredited came from the following countries: Switzerland (2 correspondents), United Kingdom (4), Luxembourg (1), Germany (3), Greece (1), Nederland (1), Denmark (3), Slovenia (1), Slovakia (1), Sweden (1) and France (1).

Most of the accredited CPD is accredited by a CPD committee or Veterinary Statutory Body. The two respondents that answered that their CPD was accredited by a European/international Accreditation Body come from Italy and Belgium. One correspondent answered that the CDP was accredited by both a CDP committee or Veterinary Statutory Body and a European/international Accreditation Body ('other').






Few correspondents answered that they might organize CPD in the future.

About half of the correspondents that offer CPD answered that they are interested in obtaining accreditation by an independent European body such as VetCEE. The other half answered they might be interested.




About 50% of respondents did know VetCEE before. The other half (indicating that they did not know VetCEE) come from a variety of countries (the majority coming from Germany (13) and the UK (28)).

1 Insights



75% of respondents clearly indicated that broadening the scope of VetCEE by accrediting different kinds of CPD would be of value. The 9 people answering negatively come from UK (1), Switzerland (2), Spain (3), Serbia (1), Bosnia-Herzegovina (1) en Belgium (1).

15. Do you think the broadening of the scope of VetCEE, aiming to accredit different kinds of CPD training in Europe, would be of value?



The great majority of respondents answered that a pan-European quality assured credit system is needed or absolutely needed. The 6 respondents that don't see a need come from the UK (2), Switzerland (1), Spain (2) and Serbia (1).

16. Do you see a need for a pan-European quality assured credit system for veterinary CPD that can facilitate mutual recognition of skills and competences achieved in one country and abroad? (i.e. in your opinion, is there a need to be able to use a credit obtained in country X to count towards CPD requirements in country Y)?




75% of correspondents think it is fair to adjust pricing according to gross domestic product of the country in which the CPD is delivered.

17. VetCEE charges CPD providers a fee per programme/event to evaluate their programmes. VetCEE is considering ways to be geographically inclusive so as many European CPD providers as possible quality assure their programmes. To achieve this, do you think it is fair to adjust pricing of the VetCEE application-fees for CPD providers according to gross domestic product (GDP) of the country in which the CPD is delivered?



The 54 correspondents that don't think it is fair to adjust pricing according to GDP come from the following countries: Australia (1), Austria (1), Belgium (4), Denmark (2), Estonia (2), France (6), Germany (4), Ireland (1), Italy (2), Macedonia (1), Netherlands (7), Slovenia (1), Spain (2), Sweden (1), Switzerland (4), UK (14) and USA (1).


